I have had the opportunity to use the JetOX system in my clinical practice. It is an exceptional tool for wound cleansing and debridement.

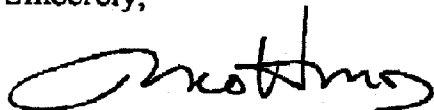
The JetOX system used for the past two years in my clinic has been highly effective for debriding difficult and painful chronic wounds. I feel it has added greatly to effective wound debridement, a key step in the care of patients with chronic non-healing wounds.

The JetOX is a less traumatic and painful method of wound debridement. As such, my patients have readily accepted it. It has allowed me to do a more effective debridement in many patients where I could not do so with traditional methods because of the pain. This feature would also be of value in the emergency department in the care and cleaning of acute wounds especially in children and anxious patients.

The JetOX is easy to use. Set up time is less than one minute. We require no additional equipment beyond a compressed oxygen source, which is readily available in most healthcare settings. Suction and AC power sources are not required as in other pulsatile wound irrigators. This has kept the cost of operation low.

I would highly recommend the use of the JetOX wound debridement system in the care of patients with non-healing wounds. It is a very valuable tool in the armamentarium of care.
